- Ouotes for new boardwalk
  - 1) Remove existing boarding and leave as natural. Low cost but difficult to walk when wet.
  - 2) Replace. 3 contractors approached. Cost in order of £14K for wood, artificial replacement would incur prohibitive costs
  - 3) Replace using volunteers/ community payback. Cost approximately £5K. Would require much organisation.

4) Recommendation to undertake temporary repairs while funding sought.

### It was resolved that temporary repairs are carried out.

- Strimmer quotes 4 quotes obtained Stilh FS130, Husqvarna 135R, Stilh FS100, Cobra BC450K. The Cobra is the cheapest.

Resolved to buy a Cobra - This comes recommended and is lighter in weight than the current model

- A parishioner asked when the common opposite his house in Upgate would be cut. This will be done in due course.
- A parishioner asked if the lane from Upgate to Reepham Road could be strimmed. This is not common land and the landowner should be approached. Reply **Action HN**
- Tree and pump. Pump was listed in 1984 when it was thatched; however early photographic evidence indicates it originally had a shingle roof. 2 other villages have reverted to a shingle roof. Roots could be the main problem to the pump. David Prior has given permission to fell the tree, if necessary.

- Highways will not sanction an island in the centre of the village, for various reasons including problem of telegraph pole. The cost of kerbing would be almost £12,000, half of which would come from the council. A discussion produced the following views:

  - tidying up required
